The success of Leadership Johns Creek, a 501c3 non-profit, prompted the creation of Student Leadership Johns Creek (SLJC) a collaborative effort of our business and civic community to provide leadership training to our local youth.

# Program Description

Student Leadership Johns Creek is a program for emerging leaders in their sophomore and junior years. Students apply in December/January of their freshman or sophomore year for the two-year program. Applicants are accepted from Centennial, Chattahoochee, Johns Creek, Northview High Schools, Innovation Academy, Mt. Pisgah and Providence Christian Academy.

The program is run by an advisory council under the board directorship of Leadership Johns Creek, a 501c3 non-profit in collaboration with Fulton County Schools.

In year one of this two-year leadership program, leadership skills will be developed through a series of structured learning experiences and then utilized in community service projects within Johns Creek. In the second year, students will have a more individualized focus, implementing the skills learned in year one to find leadership opportunities after high school and college.

A class of approximately 100 young adults will be selected from area high schools and will be introduced to a core curriculum of leadership skills including goal setting, project management, team building, governmental process and communication skills.
